

Lifeline Program



Lifeline is a government benefit program that provides discounts on monthly telephone service or Broadband for eligible low-income consumers to help ensure they have the opportunities and security that telephone service affords, including being able to connect to jobs, family, and 911 services. Lifeline is supported by the federal Universal Service Fund (USF) and WI USF.

To be eligible for assistance in this plan, an applicant must participate in one of the following programs:

- WI Badger Care
- Medical Assistance (MA)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Food Stamps (SNAP)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)/Section 8
- Veteran's Pension & Survivor's Benefits
- Income below 135% of the federal Poverty Guidelines

To apply contact Price County Telephone Co or Price County TelCom (in Park Falls)

The application form requires the last four digits of your social security number, your date of birth, signature and a copy of your benefit card or other documentation. Once your eligibility is verified, a credit will appear on your monthly telephone or Broadband bill. Please note that only one Lifeline service is available per household and you are not permitted to receive Lifeline benefits from multiple providers (either landline, Broadband or wireless/cellular).
